Web Conference Course: July 7th, 14th, 21st; 2:00 pm ET **Using Microsoft Excel to Analyse Library Collection Usage Data** *with Tony Greiner*

This 3-session course will cover material that Tony offers in day-long, face-to-face workshops in the United States.

Libraries use many methods to assess how well they are meeting the needs of the patrons they serve. One important measure is how the collection is used. This course will provide step-by-step instructions using Microsoft Excel to analyze data available from any library ILS. Instruction will be given using Excel, but the actions can be done with any readily available spreadsheet program.

Actual data from a mid-sized library will be used in the instruction. These sample files will be sent to participants so that everyone is working with common data. However, participants will be encouraged to duplicate the steps by downloading data from their own ILS. The instructor will be able to provide some guidance in the event that problems arise. For students that do not know how to retrieve data from their ILS, the instructor has posted instructions for Sirsi/Dynix Unicorn, Classic Dynix, Polaris and Innovative Interfaces "Millenium" on his Web site: <http://excelbook.pbwiki.com/>
