Liaison responsibilities include teaching, delivering information services, collection development, and acting as a faculty liaison in assigned subject areas.

Professional librarians at Acadia are primarily responsible for teaching, delivering information services, collection development, and faculty liaison in assigned subject areas. Additionally, they co-ordinate library activities or provide professional expertise in assigned cross-disciplinary service areas. The successful candidate will coordinate promotions & outreach and coordinate special collections. As faculty members, librarians are expected to participate in scholarly activities (e.g. research, conferences) as well as providing service to the university and the profession.
