The Library at Mount Saint Vincent University invites applications for a full-time, probationary position, at the rank of Librarian I, commencing on July 1, 2016. Applicants should hold an ALA-accredited Master of Library Science (or equivalent) and have experience with all aspects of core archival functions. Applicants should have reference service experience preferably in an academic library environment.

Experience in the following areas would be considered an asset:

- a background in the disciplines of cultural studies, English, history, philosophy, or religious studies
- credit or non-credit teaching, library instruction, or library orientation
- online delivery of information services and development of web-based guides and tutorials
- Rules for Archival Description and other metadata standards (e.g. Dublin Core, MODS, MADS, METS, EAD, TEI, RDF, PREMIS)
- digital repository/asset management platforms (e.g. AtoM, Dspace, Islandora, Omeka)
- web design and development (XML/XSLT, HTML/CSS, PHP/MySQL, Python)
- records management (development of retention schedules, policy, etc.)
- grant writing

Responsibilities include serving as the liaison librarian for the humanities and for the areas of scholarly communication and archives. The successful candidate will be a member of the reference team and teach the credit course LIBR 2100 *Introduction to Research in the Information Age* once per year.

Applications should include a statement of teaching interests and relevant academic and professional experience, curriculum vitae, and the names and contact information for three references. The Library will begin considering applications on January 31, 2016. Salary and benefits are in accordance with the Collective Agreement with the Faculty Association.
